SPECTATOR GUIDE

Spectator Safety

<u>Spectators may watch Rally New York USA only from designated Spectator Areas supervised by trained Safety Marshals</u> and equipped with emergency radio communications and other emergency services. The access to each Spectator Area is along a separate access road and not over the Special Stage road. Spectators are prohibited from entering and walking along the Special Stage road. For your safety, please obey the instructions of Safety Marshals in the Spectator Areas.

Please drive safely and obey speed limits
We never race on public roads open to regular traffic



1. Spectator Area at Tempaloni Road and Otens Road in Wawarsing - Free Admission. Approach from Route 209 near Nevele Resort over Oak Ridge Road.

Friday, April 4, 2008

12:30 PM – 5:00 PM

Cars will pass three times!

2. Spectator Area at Concord Resort and Golf Club in Monticello (Thompson) - Free Adm. This is a spectacular amphitheater-like Spectator Area where you can sit on the side of the hill and watch rally cars passing over a long section of this tarmac special stage in both directions and watch servicing of rally cars in the Service Park nearby.

Exit 105 on Route 17 Quickway, take Route 42 north and turn right onto Concord Road after the shopping center.

Friday, April 4, 2008

5:00 PM - 8:00 PM

Cars will pass four times!

3. Spectator Area at South Gulley Road and Mt. Cathalia Road in Wawarsing- Free Admission. A beautiful Spectator Area is located on the side of the hill overlooking a section of the stage with several interesting turns.

Approach from Ellenville on Route 52, left on South Gulley Road. You must be in the Spectator Area by 1:00 PM. The road will close at 1:00 PM and the Mt. Cathalia complex of roads will be closed until 3:30 PM.

Saturday, April 5, 2008 1:00 PM – 3:30 PM

Cars will pass two times!

4. Spectator Area at Hunter Road and Woodard Road in Neversink - Free Admission. You will be sitting in an amphitheater-like setting overlooking a fast approach and braking into a 90-degree T-junction.

Exit 99 on Route 17 Quickway in Parksville to Route 85 followed by Route 84, right on Hunter Road.

3:30 PM - 6:00 PM

5. Spectator Area at Hunter Road and Blue Hill Road in Neversink - Free Admission. In the morning, there will be a fast downhill approach to a narrow hairpin. In the afternoon, you will be able to watch the start of the Blue Hill Special Stage.

Approach from Grahamsville on Route 19, left on Hunter Road.

Welcome Rally New York USA 2008!

The best rally drivers from the United States and from abroad will compete in this exciting event. The course is 400 miles long with 100 miles of Special Stages. Rally New York USA 2008 is a round of the United States Rally Championship. It also counts toward the New York Rally Championship. We are grateful to the Governments of the Town of Wawarsing, the Village of Ellenville, the Town of Thompson, Town of Neversink, Ulster County Tourism, Sullivan County Visitors Association, local fire departments and emergency medical services, local business and civic organizations, residents and local businesses, sponsors, law enforcement personnel, countless volunteers and amateur radio operators for their support.

What is a Stage Rally?

It is a car rally with a number of Special Stages linked together by transit sections. The rally cars are typically small sedans such as Subaru Impreza or Mitsubishi Evo. On the Special Stages on public roads closed to civilian traffic, the rally cars start at one-minute intervals and race against the clock. On the transit sections, the rally cars drive in regular traffic and obey all traffic laws. If a competitor is observed speeding on a transit section, he is penalized and may be disqualified from the rally.
